- a. Dr. Leon McClinton-Director of Housing and Residential Life
  - i. Start developing your LinkedIn account.
  - ii. He is here to start dialogues about pressing matters here on campus. He intends to visit at least once a semester and hear what we have to say.
  - iii. Printers: How do we feel about them?
    - 1. Students are in favor of having working printers in each hall.
  - iv. He is happy to hear about the positive reaction to the new Wi-Fi.
  - v. Wentz does not have Wi-Fi in the basement.
  - vi. The fire alarms at Bennett have been going off repeatedly. It is currently being addressed by ResLife.
  - vii. Stout fire alarms are going off frequently. There is no information on why they are going off.
  - viii. Iba has temperature problems. Some floors are incredibly cold and others are burning hot. 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> floors are cold, 5<sup>th</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> are very hot. Wentz has the same issue. The ninth and tenth floors have no A/C at all.
  - ix. We have begun preparing for extreme cold weather, so we do not have burst pipes again. We have put thermostats in certain areas where students cannot lower the temp to a

certain degree, we have put sheet rock around the exposed pipes, and shut down the sprinkler lines outside.

- x. VP of Marketing: How are we going to handle freshman and returners wanting to stay in the ResHalls? There are students who have student loans and scholarships specifically for housing which cannot be applied if they are forced to live off of campus.
  - 1. We have vacancies. Fall 2022 we had some bad PR. There was a huge surge of Freshman enrollment and there were many returners. This collision caused a housing crisis. We did not get the number of cancellations that we typically do. We ended up putting about 20 students in lounges. We did not do enough work on the front end calling students who have signed up for housing but have not enrolled. We got ahead of that this year. Because of this crisis, we took a conservative approach and we gave returners two weeks to pick a room instead of having all spring semester to pick. Many returners missed it and had an issue getting a spot on campus. We need to be more aggressive, and if there is an overflow, we want to put students up in a hotel instead of lounges. The goal of the university is to get 5,000 freshman, but many will be from Stillwater, so we will have enough space to house all freshman and returners.
  - 2. Maybe we investigate utilizing text messaging to tell students when they can sign up for housing instead of just sending emails.
- xi. KPF: When Dr. Hallenbeck was here it was proposed that some students could use their scholarships to pay for off campus housing that is partnered with OSU.
  - 1. I would like to reach out to financial aid about this.
- xii. Please come visit me in Iba hall, email me, or set up a meeting time with me at Caribou Coffee!
- xiii. We want to get students to stay in school! We do that by engaging our communities.


